Community Survey

The survey, which I hope most of us completed, is now in the final stages of reporting. It will be compiled into a booklet describing the parish of Logie Coldstone and its needs with help from Marr Area Partnership. This booklet will be distributed to the community, funders and other interested parties.

This survey, along with the findings of the focus group, the structural and architectural surveys already done, and the health and safety requirements of the hall, will be used as the basis for an architect to complete the feasibility study into the practicality of developing the hall.

We will use the services of the RIAS (Royal Incorporation of Architects in Scotland) Consultancy in preparing the architects brief and then in identifying three practices who will be invited to bid. The Consultancy will help assess the submissions, manage the interviews and will make a recommendation regarding the team representing best value.

We have been awarded a £5000 Awards for All grant to cover the costs of the RIAS Consultancy and the design team who complete the feasibility study.

Hall Constitution

Andrea Hauxwell, from the Scottish Council of Voluntary Services is to begin the process of reviewing the constitution of the Public Hall Association with the current Committee and Trustees.

This will be a good time to go ahead with our plans, as agreed at last years AGM, to amend this document and bring it up to date and more in line with our activities and needs and as a first step to address some of our ongoing issues of management.

The legal documents may be updated but the basic aims of the Welfare Trust and the Public Hall Association will not change:

- Maintaining and improving the facilities at Logie Cold-stone Hall.
- Encouraging the development of youth welfare in the district.
- Promoting the wellbeing of the inhabitants of Logie Coldstone and district by association with the local authorities, voluntary organisations and residents in a common effort to promote social activities, to foster community spirit and to advance education.
