The Aims of Logie Coldstone Trust are as stated in the Memorandum and Articles of the Trust. Full copies of the M&A are available from the secretary of the Trust.

A. The objects for which the Company is established are the advancement of citizenship and community development by the promotion of the well being of the inhabitants of Logie Coldstone and District, by associating the local authorities, voluntary organisations and residents in a common effort to promote social activities and to foster community spirit.

B. In furtherance of its objects the Company will undertake the following particular activities:-
the maintenance and management of the Logie Coldstone Public Hall for activities promoted by the Company and its constituent bodies and to carry out any extension of the premises or facilities provided which may at any time seem necessary or desirable.

The reasons we agreed to set up this organisation with a membership base:

- Applying for membership of the Trust is then a positive affirmation of the aims of the Trust rather than taking for granted all members of the community support such aims.
- A database can be kept of contact details, and the individual skills and interests of members.
- Directors are elected by the members who have actively stated they support the aims of the Trust.
- Members as well as directors can play an active part in the organisation.
