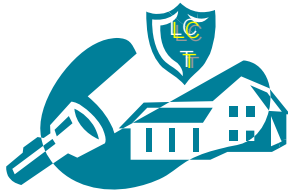

We have decided that we should concentrate on making the Hall as good as it can be by trying to raise funds to replace windows, improve insulation and draught proofing, etc. Over the last twelve months we have continued to ask YOU what you thought about this and we have now begun work on prioritising some of the issues surrounding the Hall in order to maximise the usage and do our best to make sure that the Hall is fit for purpose both now and in the future.

We now have a list of work that either the committee, members of the trust or local work men can do; then there are the other jobs that we have to get the experts in to do and most of them a local too! This work will, of course, still need money and so we continue with the events which we hope you enjoy attending and which we enjoy putting on at the hall.

The next event is the Fun Day at the end of June. 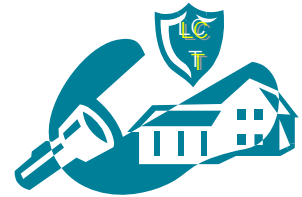
